### Radiologic Technology Program

The School of Diagnostic Imaging, Cleveland Clinic Health System, offers a certificate program in Radiologic Technology based on 21 months (5 semesters) of full time study. The Radiologic Technology Program is accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT). Students who successfully complete the program are eligible to apply for the national registry examination offered by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT). All students must have an associate degree or higher to take the ARRT Examination. The program has articulation agreements with the following local colleges for associate degree completion: Cuyahoga Community College, Kent State University, Lakeland Community College, and Lorain County Community College.

#### Financial Aid

The Radiologic Technology Program participates in federal financial aid programs and the Post 911 GI Bill.

#### Admission Requirements

**The following college-level credit bearing coursework must be completed with a grade of "C" or better by February 1st to be considered for acceptance:**

- Anatomy & Physiology I & II
  - or Anatomy & Physiology for Medical Imaging from Tri-C
- Medical Terminology

#### Admission Process

The School of Diagnostic Imaging uses a selective process to determine which students will be accepted into the Radiology Program. Acceptance is based on a point system from high school and college GPA, science and math classes and a behavior based interview. To be considered for acceptance into the Radiology Program please be aware of the following steps:

- Complete the prerequisite college credit courses as indicated under Admission Requirements.
- Fill out the Radiologic Technology Program Application available at [www.clevelandclinic.org/sodi](http://www.clevelandclinic.org/sodi)
- Send your application to the Program Director with a \$20.00 acceptance fee.
- Have your official High School and College transcripts sent directly to the school.
- After submission of the above, we will contact you to complete a mandatory 8 hour observation at a Cleveland Clinic hospital.
- Deadline for application submission is February 1st each year.
- Behavior based interviews will be scheduled in February / March for applicants who have met the previous qualifications.
- Letters regarding program acceptance will be e-mailed out approximately one month after the interview process has been completed.
- The Radiologic Technology Program starts each year in August.
